METER READINGS

Gas meters are read on the first Wednesday of every month. Please make sure your meters are accessible, gates are unlocked, and dogs are secured.

WATER HYDRANTS

As many of you already know, Coronado Village has its own personal well water tank. Every 1st Wednesday of the month (during the same time gas meters are read), water hydrants are opened to flush the lines. During this short period of time, water pressure may decrease and your water might brown a bit. All is totally normal and is a part of the process of ensuring the water in the community stays fresh and sanitary.



The Lowdown on Elections

Every four years, Americans head to the polls in November to cast ballots for the nation's president.

- Prior to 1804, the presidential candidate who received the secondhighest number of electoral votes was named the vice president.
- The only bachelor elected president was James Buchanan.
- John F. Kennedy was the youngest elected U.S. president at 43. Joe Biden was the oldest at 77.
- The only president and vice president not elected to either office was Gerald Ford. He became vice president after Spiro Agnew resigned and became president when Richard Nixon resigned.

Homemade Mashed Potatoes

Simple and satisfying, mashed spuds are a classic side dish for holiday meals, but easy enough to cook up for a weeknight dinner.

Ingredients:

- 2 pounds baking potatoes (about 6 medium)
- 2 teaspoons salt, divided
- 1 cup milk
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper **Directions**:

Peel potatoes, then cut into chunks. Place in a large pot and cover with water. Add 1 teaspoon salt. Over medium heat, bring to a boil. Reduce heat and continue cooking until potatoes are fork tender, about 20 minutes.

Drain potatoes well then return them to pot. Mash with a fork or potato masher until smooth.

In a small saucepan, heat milk and butter over low heat until butter is melted. Pour mixture over potatoes and stir to combine. Season with remaining salt and pepper.

Pumpkin Picture Frame

Display a special memory on a cute pumpkin. It's easy!

Materials:

- Foam paintbrush
- Orange acrylic craft paint
- 8 jumbo craft sticks
- Hot glue gun and glue
- Brown pipe cleaner
- Green pipe cleaner
- Double-sided tape
- A photograph
- 2 round magnets (optional)

Directions:

First, make the pumpkin. Paint six of the craft sticks orange. Let dry. Then, flip the sticks over and line them up vertically side-to-side to make a rectangle. Glue the unpainted sticks across the rectangle horizontally, one near each end, to hold the rectangle together.

Twist the brown pipe cleaner into a small square—the pumpkin's stem. Wrap the green pipe cleaner around your finger, then slide it off, to make a curly vine. Glue the stem and vine to the back of the pumpkin, making sure you can see them when you flip the pumpkin back over.

Use double-sided tape to attach a photograph to the front of the pumpkin. If desired, you can glue two magnets to the back of the pumpkin or simply hang it by the stem.
